## Rushcliffe students discover the world of apprenticeships – thanks to Uniper

Students from Rushcliffe School in Nottingham have been discovering the benefits of apprenticeships thanks to a series of presentations from Uniper.

"The founder of Kwik-Fit, fashion designer Stella McCartney and TV chef Jamie Oliver all started their careers as apprentices – and even Sir Alex Ferguson began his working life as an apprentice in the shipyards," said Andrew Hawksworth, Development Programme Coordinator at Uniper's Engineering Academy.

"We wanted to give local students a glimpse of what the apprenticeship career route could offer them and show them the range of options available. It was also a great opportunity to give them some examples of what we offer at our Academy at Ratcliffe.

So far, around 500 students have attended the special assemblies, which have been arranged as part of National Apprenticeship Week 2017.

Students say they found the presentation very informative, with many saying they hadn't realised there were different levels of apprenticeships and that the information had 'opened up their options.

Said Caroline Tomlinson, Teacher of Modern Foreign Languages and Head of Careers at Rushcliffe School: "The growth in apprenticeship places is something that schools and students cannot afford to overlook and the potential for quality training rather than following a traditional college or 'A' level route is something that all students should at least consider.

"It is a huge benefit to schools to have assemblies from outside providers that outline the options that are available to students. Andy Hawksworth's presentation was informative and engaging; the students gained both knowledge and inspiration. Thank you!"

Added Andy: "It was fantastic to have the opportunity to speak to so many young people about apprenticeships. Hopefully they have gone away with a better understanding of what an apprenticeship is and more will consider it as a future pathway.
