David was an apprentice with MANWEB prior to going to university and joining E.ON as a Graduate Engineer. At E.ON, David worked in a variety of roles in its Distribution business, before becoming Academic Partnership Manager and then Head of Professional Development at the Engineering Academy. David took over the role of Head of the Engineering Academy in 2012, rebranding to Uniper when E.ON and Uniper separated in 2016.
